
Parking on grass while collecting children - We have had some parents caught out when collecting children at the end of the day and Mr Dawson and helpers have had to push three cars out of the mud by the library. Please think carefully about this area as it is turning into mud and causing issues for drivers. I am awaiting a quote to see if we can compact it and shingle it but this will not be cheap.

Absences / Lateness and Justified absences - by law we fill in attendance every day at school. These documents are used when requested by the MOE or in the case of family court proceedings. We are seeing an increase in lateness and just recently some dubious decisions to keep children home for birthdays and to celebrate them during school time at timezones or entertainment places in Christchurch. Two recent decisions have caused concern and we have followed them up.

The insert here is from the attendance material supplied to school by the Ministry of education and highlights the extreme situations we have not found ourselves in yet. We do however have children in our school with 70-80% attendance rates that highlight potential for progress to lessen and achievement to drop.

- Please do your very best to get your children to school on time every day.
- Call us and tell us if your children are sick.
- Celebrate birthdays in the weekend or after school please.
- Be prepared for children to marked late and then for the Truancy officer to be in touch if patterns develop. We have a range of children late from 3 - 42 days this year.

Lets all just **“Be better”** at this. Education is important for our children and some of us are not taking this seriously enough. I have up to 11 or 12 families to talk to now and some who have had extended overseas trips but I need to reiterate the role you have in getting your children to school on time. Help us help your children. I want better for them and I am sure you do too!



Parents are responsible for their child's regular attendance at school:

Every parent of a person who while enrolled at a registered school, does not attend... commits an offence, and is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding an amount calculated at the rate of \$30 for every school day for which the offence has occurred... A fine imposed for an offence against that subsection shall not exceed \$300 for a first offence... or \$3,000 for a second or subsequent offence (Section 29).

In proceedings under this part of the Act (prosecutions), the burden of proving any of the following matters in relation to a person is on the person's parent:

- (a) the enrolment of the person at a school*
- (b) the person's attendance at a school*
- (c) the person's exemption from enrolment or attendance at a school (Section 34).*
