Dear Parents and Caregivers

Welcome to week 7. The term is flying by and we have a lot happening. Our Cricket teams enjoyed their day last week and we hope the Rippa Rugby competition gets underway this week.

Finances

The new Labour Government is looking at making some contributions to schools to lift our operational grants. This may be a grant of around \$150 per child. This is something our school would certainly support. At this point in time our school seeks donations at \$15 per term, per child and also a contribution towards activities. The donation is exactly that and we get about 50% of donations paid. The contribution towards activities is a little more important to us as it covers a multitude of things. It is also \$15 per term per pupil.

Below is a list of some of the costs we pay for students at school and your contributions support this. We also cover the Life Education costs and visits to the school by other visitors and sometimes they are just a \$2 charge and your contributions help us out.

- Linewize Internet filtering \$5.50 per student per year
- Edge School Management System \$5.65 per student per year
- Library, Finance and Asset management \$2.80 per student per year
- Mathletics Year 3-8 \$31.08 per student per year
- Reading Eggs \$33.20 per student per year
- Hapara internet management software \$4.95 per student per year

As well as these costs we also cover many of the bus trips for students. Last year the swimming costs with buses and entry to the pool cost almost \$12000 with us bringing in \$7600 from your payments leaving the school covering the other \$4400. Some of this is still to come in with us invoicing for swimming not yet paid but we will still have the short fall to cover to do our very best to maintain some equity in the school and access to curriculum for all pupils.

Decisions from the Government will be happening soon and so we will invoice for stationery and swimming and hold at this point in time on the contributions. Donations can still be made at anytime to support the school and we are very grateful to the local business owner who provides us \$40 a week to cover bread, butter, fillings and snacks for any children who need extra at school. Your personal donations do not feed children.

Rakaia 101 - I am holding another opportunity for parents to hear a little about how the school runs and what we are about. This is an introduction to Rakaia School and we ran them twice last year. This will be held tomorrow March 13 at 12 noon in Room 4/staff room.
