After such a tragic and surreal weekend it is important to look at what we can do to ensure our children are supported. This is something we never expected in NZ but it is just like the world has reached out and grabbed us and shaken the innocence from our very core.



Nathan Wallis has written this for our schools and parents

1. Turn off tv and media - it will reinforce the trauma
2. Show you are concerned like them, but still feel safe now. If you feel safe, they are likely too
- 3 express confidence in how quickly the police responded and their ability to protect us.
- 4 be esp aware of how your “tween” is responding. Eleven is a very vulnerable age for loss and grief and our eleven yr olds have already been traumatised by the quakes
- 5 Give them a sense of agency by telling them that people are wearing colours to school on Friday the 22nd. Children can come as colourful as they like to show solidarity for our Muslim friends and families. A coin donation will be collected.

Pamper them, cuddle them, support them. If they are responding particularly badly - take them to a safe place out of chch if u can - the sooner the trauma stops for them the better they will recover

I am in communication with the Christchurch Principals and listening to the advice from the Ministry of Education. Please feel free to contact us at school if you have any questions or concerns for our children.

Please be aware i feel it is only appropriate to revisit lock down procedures and we will inform you of any new developments within our school. This will be done in the next week or so.
