It is important to recognise that the Rakaia School Board of Trustees have elected to again support our teachers for this occasion.

The school will need to close during this strike.

Strike - Principal Comment: I wanted an opportunity to share with you my thoughts and concerns around the proposed strike action we are taking. I need to assure the Rakaia School community that myself and the staff never wanted to upset or inconvenience you however we feel we have been pressured into the situation with the government's inability to recognise the concerns we have with our vocation and profession.

It is challenging times in the world when you have to wait up to 11 months to get support for a child and then have to go through the same hoops to set the scene. Children are incredibly

more challenging and complex and it has the tendency to derail a room when a child just refuses to work at all.

Staff are struggling to meet demands and the release time compared to our secondary colleagues is just a joke. We need at least 20 hours per term PPT (Professional Practice Time) and we currently get 10 hours.

We need the following things addressed to improve working conditions and the future of our profession.

- Address workload
- Teacher shortage
- Time to teach and time to lead
- Career development

I love my job. I love my kids and I am proud of my staff who do not get enough of me because I am strapped to the chair dealing with paperwork and trying to get extra staffing and finances to do what we can for our pupils.

Give me time to be at the front of my school so I can be in rooms and with my staff and children.

I am very happy to talk with you if you have concerns or questions and we thank the BOT for their support.
