Many of our situations arise from misunderstandings, competitive situations, personalities clashing and the normal playground incidents that happen in every school, workplace and family in NZ.

Our biggest challenge is to teach our children some resilience and the belief they are OK with who they are. People's views and opinions of us are not ours to worry about.

This is not always easy and even as adults we stumble while navigating all that life throws at us. I want to encourage you to reiterate our values of Partnership, Quality and Respect at your home and place of work and within your family.

At Rakaia School we promise to do our best with your children. The staff and BOT are committed to providing an environment where your children have a voice and we will also do our very best to challenge them while having fun. Strategically we aim to have Inspirational staff, Innovative BOT, Engaged students and an Involved Community. We will not always get it right but the intent with all we do is to meet these goals.

The other challenge for us at the moment is teaching children how to respect others and their space and their differences. What makes our school so special is the diversity but with that comes some conflict occasionally. I am strong on not wanting any of our children to be victims. I want them to feel strong enough to walk away or to deal with a problem in a positive way.

Resilience is the key and there are a lot of articles online about this. We will also have our own thoughts and actions that help us achieve this for our families. My challenge is for the Rakaia School Community to concentrate on developing students who are active learners, kind and compassionate and respectful. I am sure we will all agree that this type of student will thrive in an ever changing world.

Role Model Model resilient behaviors. Be calm and consistent. Admit your own mistakes and talk about how you'll get better next time.

Let Them Make Mistakes Let them see the consequences of their actions

Let them see the consequences of their actions. They will learn how to bounce back from their mistakes and do better next time.



Praise The Right Way Give "process praise" by focusing



Teach to Manage Emotions

Teach that *all* emotions are okay. Deal with bad behavior to set limits. Brainstorm ways to fix the problem and prevent it in the future.



Teach to Problem Solve Don't ush to solve problems for them or tell them the solution. Brainstorm solutions to address the challenge. Discuss potential consequences of each solution.

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
